Classes are designed to help you improve basic reading, writing, and math skills geared to assist you in preparing for the High School Equivalency exam (GED, HiSET). All classes are offered in person with some online options.

Students interested in citizenship can start preparing for the citizenship interview and test now.

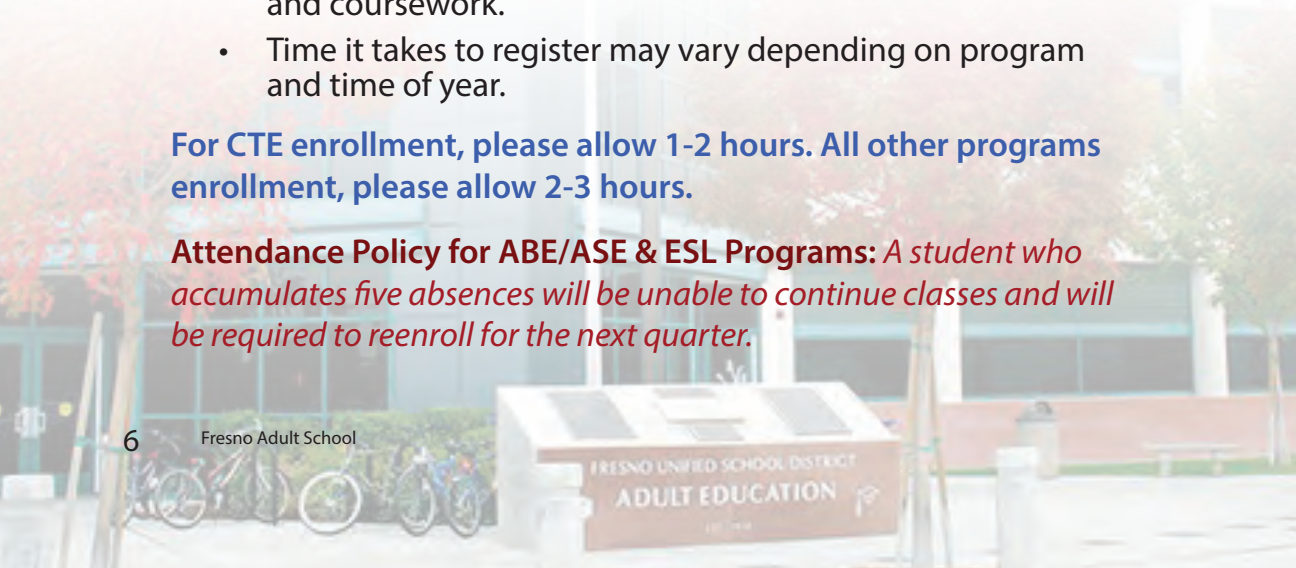

1. You must be at least 18 years old.
2. Bring your photo ID to Fresno Adult School's Main Office
3. Complete a CASAS placement assessment (not required for most CTE courses)
4. Receive a schedule and a date to begin classes
5. Please note:
 - High School Diploma students are required to schedule an appointment with the counselor to obtain their schedule and coursework.
 - Time it takes to register may vary depending on program and time of year.

For CTE enrollment, please allow 1-2 hours. All other programs enrollment, please allow 2-3 hours.

Adult Secondary Education

Earn your High School Diploma or prepare to pass your High School Equivalency Exam.



What is Adult Basic Education?

Adult Basic Education (ABE) classes are designed to help you improve basic reading, writing, and math skills. These classes will help you brush up on basic skills and prepare you for the high school diploma program, the high school equivalency program, and CTE courses.

What is Edgenuity?

Edgenuity is an on-line platform that offers all required courses needed for graduation. Edgenuity is offered in an on campus setting where a teacher supports students with the following: Opening tests, tutoring, new course assignment support, 1:1 student progress review, etc. Students work on-site with an Edgenuity instructor in our Edgenuity Lab.

What is AZTEC?

Aztec is an on-line program offered on-site at FAS that includes basic skills support, high school equivalency preparation, and high school equivalency preparation in Spanish.



What is the High School Diploma Program?

The High School Diploma (HSD) program offers a wide variety of educational classes in order for the continuing learner to earn their high school diploma. Students may take a combination of traditional instruction courses, on-line Edgenuity courses, and independent study courses. All high school diploma classes are offered in person. ***All students are currently required to have their own device (technology) to attend any remote only classes (must meet eligibility requirements).**

English as a Second Language

What is the ESL Program?

Our English as a Second Language (ESL) program focuses on helping students improve listening, speaking, reading and writing skills in English so that they can communicate better in the community and prepare for post-secondary education or career training. Career Technical Education (CTE) courses are also available for ESL students.

Citizenship

Students in the Citizenship program prepare for the citizenship interview and 100 question civics test. Review important facts about American history and government. Learn about American culture and geography and how to complete the N-400 application for naturalization. Receive one-on-one oral practice to prepare for the naturalization interview.

Computer Applications

This course is for those who have mastered a basic understanding of computer foundations and are ready to build their skills in the Microsoft Office and the Google Suite.

Digital Literacy

(This is NOT a pre-requisite of Computer Applications)

This course is for people that have little to no experience with computers. It is focused on basic computer foundations: how to use a mouse, touch typing, computer parts and processes, email and internet basics.

ESL Beginning Literacy

Listening/Speaking: Functions minimally, if at all, in English. Communicates only through gestures and a few isolated words. Can understand simple yes/no questions and some questions.

Reading/Writing: Can understand very common words and symbols to meet basic personal and survival needs. Can understand important information on flyers and signs, such as time, days of the week, months, years, and numbers 1-100. Can recognize the meaning of some frequently occurring words and phrases on simple public signs and very basic forms.

ESL Beginning Low

Listening/Speaking: Functions in a very limited way in situations related to immediate needs; asks and responds to basic learned phrases spoken slowly and repeated often. Can understand common yes/no questions and wh- questions on familiar topics.

Reading/Writing: Can understand transportation, health, and workplace signs with multiple words or symbols and can comprehend short texts such as simple work forms. Can understand frequently occurring words, simple phrases, and formulaic expressions beyond basic needs such as in labels and work schedules.

ESL Beginning High

Listening/Speaking: Functions with some difficulty in situations related to immediate needs; may have some simple oral communication abilities using basic learned phrases and sentences. Can take turns in interactions with others and respond to simple wh- questions with noticeable ease. Can participate in and understand the main idea of conversations about familiar topics and contexts.

Reading/Writing: Can understand simple material on familiar topics such as workplace notices, advertisements, and common forms. With support, can identify the main topic and locate information in short familiar texts and ordered lists. Can determine the meaning of frequently occurring words, phrases, and expressions in written texts about familiar topics such as basic directions, schedules, signs, maps, and menus.



ESL Intermediate Low

Listening/Speaking: Can satisfy basic survival needs and very routine social demands. Understands simple learned phrases easily and some new simple phrases containing familiar vocabulary, spoken slowly with frequent repetition. Can integrate the ideas of multiple speakers in routine conversations and answer relevant questions about familiar topics. Can follow basic rules for discussion and ask questions to gain information and clarify understanding.

Reading/Writing: Can understand text in formats such as tables, checklists, and more detailed forms in the workplace. With help, can cite specific details from and summarize texts such as routine emails and webpage content. Using context, can determine the meaning of general words and phrases and frequently occurring expressions in written texts about familiar every day and work contexts, such as in simple written instructions and basic terms uncommon computer applications.

ESL Intermediate High

Listening/Speaking: Can satisfy basic survival needs and limited social demands; can follow oral directions in familiar contexts. Has limited ability to understand on the telephone. Understands learned phrases easily and new phrases containing familiar vocabulary. Can participate in routine conversations, discussions, and exchanges of information about a range of work and life topics and issues delivered at a normal rate. Can understand instructions in a variety of contexts.

Reading/Writing: Can understand the overall structure of most written materials in everyday and workplace communications and as well as diagrams. The class enhances students' ability to apply reading skills for

efficient online document and information retrieval. The class fosters proficiency with some technical vocabulary related to work needs and a growing number of idiomatic expressions which aid in understanding website organization and business correspondence.

FCC English for Multi-Lingual Speakers - Reading/Writing

Reading/Writing: Can understand the overall structure of most written materials in every day, and workplace communications as well as diagrams. Can apply reading skills to searching for documents and information online efficiently. Has proficiency with some technical vocabulary related to work needs and a growing number of idiomatic expressions which aid in understanding website organization and business correspondence.

FCC English for Multi-Lingual Speakers - Listening/Speaking

Listening/Speaking: Can satisfy basic survival needs and limited social demands; can follow oral directions in familiar contexts. Has limited ability to understand on the telephone. Understands learned phrases easily and new phrases containing familiar vocabulary. Can participate in routine conversations, discussions, and exchanges of information about a range of work and life topics and
